Mount Roland Land Care's 1000+ Trees Project is looking for volunteer tree planters this September at Claude Road and Barrington. We'd love you to join us. RSVP essential.

Continuing a Shelterbelt ~ Saturday September 2nd

At 349 Claude Road, **accessed via Jeffries Road** (first entrance on the left), Sarah and Matt Watt continue to build their vision for a healthy, biodiverse landscape. Mount Roland Land Care are on board with the continuation of a shelterbelt along the Claude Road border. The planting will be on flat ground and access is easy (look for our large yellow flags 4.7km from Sheffield, towards Mt Roland). Start time: 10am. Please bring your own water, clean gardening gloves, clean sturdy shoes and weather-appropriate clothing. Also bring your favourite, clean planting tool (if you have one). Standard tools will also be available. At 12 NOON a shared lunch will be provided. We will be planting 200⁺ plants of various shapes and sizes, increasing habitat for various species, capturing a little more carbon, boosting soil health, and providing shade.

Stream Revegetation ~ Sunday September 17th

At 1915 Sheffield Road, on land known as White Hawk Falls, the planting will again contribute to a landholder's larger vision. Mark and Cindy Thompson have cleared a large amount of blackberry and willow from White Hawk Creek (the quest continues) and are embarking on a large revegetation project. Our work will be to plant 200⁺ plants along the Creek near the entrance to the farm (look for our yellow flags 4.3km from Sheffield, towards Barrington). Start time: 10am. Please bring your own water, clean gardening gloves, clean sturdy shoes and weather-appropriate clothing. Also bring your favourite, clean planting tool (if you have one). Standard tools will also be available. At 12 NOON a shared lunch will be provided.

Also: On September 9th, we will be planting a smaller number of trees just out of Sheffield on Nook Road. This will be a particularly special event for all who have the pleasure of knowing MRLC life member, Clive Bott. The trees will be on Clive's farm, replacing a row of gums lost to last year's wind storm with blackwoods and a copse of wet-loving wonders. Let us know if you'd like to be involved. And bring your gumboots!
